Exhibits will be judged on uniformity, quality and freedom from blemishes and insect damage. All vegetables must be grown, selected and arranged by exhibitor. Preference is given to vegetables that are free from dirt, but not washed. Root vegetables (such as onions, beets, and carrots) must have 1- inch stem. Preference is given to tomatoes that have stems left on. Include a list of specimens in Class C, 1-3, in order to educate those enjoying the exhibit hall about the various species and varieties displayed. In all cases, stems are preferred.

2. Display of at least 5 vegetables, properly identified, in an appropriate container, such as a chopping bowl, wheelbarrow, basket, or tray.
3. Collection of at least 6 vegetables, properly identified and arranged for effect and quality on a 9-square foot table area (i.e. card table). Table must be furnished by exhibitor. The vegetables must be exhibited in the quantities listed on previous page (i.e., 15 Lima bean pods).
