1. Herbs, fresh collection of at least 5 herbs, properly identified, in a suitable container, 5 specimens of each herb.
 2. Display of at least 5 vegetables, properly identified, in an appropriate container, such as a chopping bowl, wheelbarrow, basket, or tray.
 3. Collection of at least 6 vegetables, properly identified and arranged for effect and quality on a 9-square foot table area (ie. card table). Table must be furnished by exhibitor. The vegetables must be exhibited in the quantities listed on previous page (i.e., 15 Lima bean pods).
